fantastic potato characters as part of our competition. Photographs were taken of all the entries and judging will take place soon.

Science Day The whole school enjoyed a super day at the end of last term with a celebration of all things 'STEM' (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). It was great to see the children all dressed up in their 'STEM' career outfits. Each class took part in a whole school challenge to pass a message on from Nursery, through each class until it reached Y6 at the end of the day. I was there to witness our oldest children deciphering the message via Morse Code – 'Science is FUN!' A range of methods were used to pass the message on – SOS signals using flashlights, catapults and parachutes, boats and chain-reactions! Thank you to Mrs Scragg for her organisation of the day and to our visiting speakers.

Year 6 SATs In the week beginning Tuesday 9th May, our Year 6 children will be taking their SATs. Please could parents support their child with any homework set over the next few weeks to help them prepare for these assessments. The dates of tests are fixed so it is essential that all children are in school every day that week unless circumstances make absence unavoidable. Due to the Coronation Bank Holiday on Monday 8th, this year's tests will take place on the Tuesday to Friday. If children miss one paper (for whatever reason), it will mean that they will not get a test grade in that subject. We will be encouraging the children to have at least eight hours sleep per night and be punctual each day! I'm sure all our children will try their best and will make us all proud!

Parent Workshops Thank you to all the parents who attended our Phonic and Reading workshops last term. We hope you found them useful and gave you some ideas on how to support your child with their reading at home, whatever stage of the reading journey they may be on. Thank you to Mr Davis for his work in preparing and delivering these workshops.

Toddler and Baby Group We are very excited to announce that plans are being put in place for a St Paul's Stay and Play session for parents / carers and their babies and toddlers! We hope this will provide a valuable opportunity for adults and their children to meet and play, as well as access support and information and get to know our school community. Funds raised through school-led clubs will be used to fund club resources / other clubs in


